The Archaic Period, spanning from roughly 10,000 to 2,500 B.P., covers a large period of prehistory but is virtually unknown in the Grand valley. This presentation will draw on research in surrounding regions such as the Saginaw and St. Joseph River valleys to provide some picture of what the Archaic in the Grand River valley might have been like. Due to the absence of excavated sites the presentation will focus heavily on projectile point typologies, using, among other resources, information from past issues of the Coffinberry News Bulletin.
